Northamptonshire County Council 2018-19 Budget Consultation: Phase 2

Questionnaire

The financial challenge and the need for change

The money the Council receives from the Government has been reducing for some time and will do so again in 2018/19. Since 2010, we have delivered savings totalling £376 million. By 2021, our total savings will have risen to £0.5 billion. On top of this, we are facing higher than ever demand for our services. We have made a number of difficult choices over the last few years to make the savings we needed, and we need to do this again to make sure that we have enough money in our budget to run services that meet statutory requirements (what we must do) and help those who need it the most.

Our population is growing and its needs are changing. New responsibilities for the Council have placed huge pressures on our public services in the county. As a result of this, and changes at a national level (including Brexit and a new minority Conservative government) we must look again at our financial plans. We are making our case to the Government for Fairer Funding to address this (<http://www3.northamptonshire.gov.uk/councilservices/council-and-democracy/budgets-and-spending/Pages/fairer-funding-for-northamptonshire.aspx>), but we need to act now to make sure we have enough money in our budget for 2018/19 to meet all the pressures we face.

- By 2024, it is projected that the population of Northamptonshire will have grown by approximately 9% to 778,600 people; faster than the projected 7.5% increase for England. By this date it is projected that the number of people aged 65+ will be 28.2% higher than in 2014, compared to a 20.4% increase nationally (England average).
- We have seen a huge rise in the number of Children in Care (almost 23% in the past 3 years) with figures at over 1,000 since the summer. The cost of placements for Children in Care has increased by 47.4% in the same period.
- Numbers of Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (UASC) have also increased, which adds to the financial pressures within the service, as Government funding only covers around two-thirds of the actual costs.



- Although demand in adult social care has stayed roughly the same, individual costs are increasing because people's needs require more complex care - the average cost for clients aged 18-64 has increased by 3.7% per week (an average increase from £668 to £693) and the average cost for clients aged 65+ has increased by 27.7% per week (an average increase from £317 to £405).
- The customer service centre handles (on average) 18,000 phone calls and 7,000 emails/eforms each month. It is estimated that 40% of the county population has contacted the customer service centre, or been the subject of a contact in the last five years. The website attracts an average of 350,000 visits each month, consisting of around 200,000 unique users.

What have we done so far?

In October 2017, we launched a consultation on Phase 1 of our budget proposals. This marked the start of the work we have been doing to look at what we might need to change in terms of how we deliver our services and whether we need to reduce or stop anything we currently do. The Phase 1 proposals added up to a value of £9.6m and the consultation on most of those proposals ended on 1st December. The review of Library Services, which is under a separate consultation, ends on 13th January 2018, and the review of the Short Breaks service ended earlier in December.

Phase 2 of our consultation is now live. This includes consultation on the level of Council Tax we propose to set for 2018/19 and more savings and income generation proposals (adding up to a value of £24.7m) on how we will manage next year's budget. It also includes the draft Council Plan 2018-19 to 2019-20, which sets out our vision for how we will deliver services and be financially sustainable.

Your feedback on this consultation is really important to us, and all consultation feedback from both phases will be analysed and considered, and will help Councillors make a final decision on the Budget at the Full Council meeting on 22nd February 2018. Proposed increase in Council Tax

As part of the Draft Budget Proposals, we are proposing to increase the council tax rate by 4.98% in 2018/19.

For an average (Band D) council tax payer, this would mean an increase of £1.12 per week for the Northamptonshire County Council element.

This 4.98% increase consists of two parts: a 1.98% increase which will be used to fund all services provided by the county council, and an additional 3% increase which follows the government's decision to allow local authorities to increase council tax for the specific purpose of funding adult social care. Under current rules, the council would have to hold a referendum on the proposed increase in council tax if the total increase (including up to 3% for the Adult Social Care Precept) is equal to or greater than 5%. The cost of running a referendum for an authority the size of Northamptonshire could cost up to £1m.

By increasing council tax by 4.98%, this would provide the council with a total of £292.86m of funding from council tax.

Without this additional funding, the council would not be able to deliver the planned draft budget and frontline services would be further threatened.

Trade Waste controls at Household Waste Recycling Centres

- Introduction of improved systems to control trade waste disposal at Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs). This is likely to be a permit system, which will require residents who wish to bring household waste to the nine HWRCs using a van, pick-up truck, horsebox, trailer, or any other vehicle without windows or seats in the rear, to register and use an e-permit. A permit will be issued for free to residents who drive commercial type vehicles and who wish to deposit household waste. The Permit will limit the number of visits to 6 per year. This will distinguish between household waste that has been transported in a vehicle other than a car, and trade waste, which is chargeable (£200k saving resulting from improved controls to stop the free disposal of trade waste).

- Changes to the on-street pay and display parking in Northampton town centre to include: extending the timescales for when pay and display charges will be applied to between 7am - 7pm Monday to Sunday inclusive (current operations are applied 8am - 6pm Monday to Friday with no charges on Sunday); increase on-street pay and display parking charges from £1 per hour to £1.20 per hour; and increase the maximum allowable stay to on-street pay and display parking from 1 hour to 2 hours. - Centralisation of and commercialisation of Communications and Marketing functions: Centralisation of all communications and marketing staff into one unit followed by restructure of this centralised team to streamline activity. Begin moving toward a fully self-funded model. This builds on the centralisation proposal in Phase 1 (£300k saving)
- BIPM Centralisation: A restructure of the Business Intelligence and Project Management (BIPM) service. The restructure will impact on all functions delivered by the service. (£1m saving)

Children's Services

- Staff Vacancy Management: Management of staff vacancies within Children's Services (£250k saving).

LGSS (Local Government Shared Services)

- LGSS Procurement: Propose charging a success fee to winning bidder(s). (£250k saving)

Place Services

- Asset Restructure: Make the best use of office space within Angel Square (the Council's head office). (£1.135m saving)
- Planning Resource: Deletion of a Senior Planning Officer post. (£40k saving)
