What is the consultation title?\*

Proposal to amalgamate Earls Barton Infant and Junior Schools, Wellingborough

What is this consultation about?\*

Following an initial period of consultation on the proposed amalgamation of Earls Barton Infant and Junior Schools between September and October 2016, an NCC Cabinet Member Decision of 1st November gave approval for the local authority (Northamptonshire County Council) to undertake a further month-long period of consultation on this proposed amalgamation.

In accordance with Section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act (2006) notice is given that Northamptonshire County Council is proposing to:

- Discontinue Earls Barton Junior School on 31st December 2016.

- Change the age range of Earls Barton Infant School from 4-7 years to 4-11.

Following these interdependent changes, the schools will amalgamate to become a full primary school ('Earls Barton Primary School').

During this period of consultation, the local authority would like to hear from anyone with an interest in this proposed amalgamation.
