What is the consultation title?*

Proposed amalgamation of Earls Barton Infant and Junior Schools

What is this consultation about?*

In partnership with the governing bodies of both Earls Barton Infant School and Earls Barton Junior School, Northamptonshire County Council is proposing to merge Earls Barton Infant and Junior Schools, to create a standard, 4-11 primary school. Subject to consultation and approvals, it is anticipated that by January 2017, the two schools will operate as a single primary school.

There are several reasons underlying the proposed amalgamation of the two schools, and it is felt that the merger will:

- Create more secure and effective long-term working relations between local schools
- Help to ensure sustainable, consistent high-quality provision for all children
- Ensure a seamless transition from Key Stage 1 (infant) to Key Stage 2 (junior)
- Help to create a single and continuous approach to the curriculum, with single policies for all core subjects
- Provide better development opportunities for staff, such as shared training and closer collaborative work.
