## About the consultation

What is the consultation title?\*

Proposed expansion of All Saints CEVA Primary School, Wellingborough

What is this consultation about?\*

Northamptonshire County Council is proposing to double the number of places available at All Saints CEVA Primary School, Castle Street, Wellingborough, from the current 210 places (30 places per year group) to 420 places in total (60 places per year group).

However, as there is no room for expansion on the current site, it is proposed that a second site for the school is established at Croyland Road, which would be operated as an annex to the existing school.

Once fully open, the annex is expected to provide an additional 210 places (30 places per year group from Reception to Year 6), with the places becoming available from September 2017.

If approved, the new annex will also open in phases, to minimise the potential impact on any other nearby primary provision.

This annex is being proposed as a means of helping to meet the high levels of demand for pupil places in Wellingborough, and across most of Northamptonshire. Over the past decade, Wellingborough has seen a significant rise in housing development and in-migration, and despite the county council commissioning new capacity in other primary schools in the area, the availability of places in the town centre (especially in Reception, Year 1, Year 4 and Year 5) is extremely limited. Northamptonshire County Council has a statutory responsibility to ensure that there are sufficient school places available to meet the needs of local children, and this annex is seen as an important means of ensuring that NCC can continue to do this.

Please note: this consultation is about the principle of expanding the PAN (Published Admissions Number) of All Saints CEVA Primary, rather than a consultation about the details of the new annex, and how this will be built. These building proposals will be subject to separate, statutory consultation, which will be undertaken by the planning authority once a planning application has been received.

An informal pre-planning event will be scheduled in due course, to allow all interested parties an opportunity to see the plans for the annex.
